- Farmer's Market. Still doing story time, selling \$50 for 50<sup>th</sup> tickets, raffle tickets, soliciting donations. Down to under 100 tickets. More \$50 donations than tickets. Everyone encouraged to sign up for reading at least once, very fulfilling.
- Summer reading. Kickoff, June 20<sup>th</sup>. Laura has located two musicians, Richard & John, and we will have Deborah Fellman and her balloons, plus Shirley the Bird Lady. Watermelon. Crafts, finger painting, simple crafts, stencils. Grill and table for food, water next to the building. Clay will get large pack of hot dogs, ketchup, and mustard. Small bottles of water.
